IT TOOLS

Identification glossary

- IDUL: Identifiant Unique ULaval, it consists of a maximum of 8 characters and is generally made up of 5 letters followed by 0 to 3 digits. It is used to access many of Université Laval's IT services.
- Password (NIP): it is used as a password in several Université Laval systems. In particular, it is used to access monPortail.
- NI: Numéro d'identification, it consists of 9 digits and is indicated on your official documents. The NI appears on the Université Laval identity card issued at the beginning of the session.

Wireless Internet (Wi-Fi)

- All students registered at Université Laval are automatically subscribed to the **eduroam or eduroam2** wireless network.
- Access is available 24 to 48 hours after registration.
- The UL_Visiteur_Guest and UL_Visiteurs_Guest2 networks are available to everyone without a password, but the eduroam and eduroam2 wireless networks are preferable as they provide greater security.
- To access the wireless Internet network at Université Laval:
 - 1. Select **eduroam** or **eduroam2** network
 - 2. Enter your IDUL@ulaval.ca
 - 3. Enter your **password** (PIN)
 - 4. If your phone requires network authentication, click on "Trust".



monPortail



- **Digital learning environment** providing centralized access to a range of learning-related services and information.
- In particular, this platform provides access to:
 - o course registration
 - o important study-related messages
 - o communication and planning tools
 - o **course sites** (course outlines, course materials, evaluation results, assignment submission, etc.)

ULaval email address and Capsule

- Email address @ulaval.ca: to be consulted regularly! The Bureau de la vie étudiante, the Registrar's Office, your program director, professors, etc., will only communicate with you at this address.
- The features of **Capsule**: this is where you'll find your transcripts and unofficial progress report. This is also where you can change your address.



SUBMISSION OF LEGAL DOCUMENTS

Which documents to submit?

REGULAR STUDY PROGRAM: you must submit your study permit and CAQ in the "Admission" "Legal documents" section of the "Studies" menu in monPortail.

EXCHANGE PROGRAM: upon arrival, you must submit your legal documents or proof of entry into Canada using the <u>designated form</u>.

- copy of passport
- if applicable:
 - o copy of entry stamp indicating arrival date
 - o copy of study permit
 - copy of visitor record
 - if you don't have any of the above 3 documents, you must provide a copy of your airline ticket showing your arrival date, including the year.




















IDENTITY CARD AND PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

Université Laval's identity card



- Following your registration, an important message will be sent to monPortail inviting you to submit a photo for the production of your ULaval identity card.
- If you have problems with the photo you have submitted, please go to the Registrar's Office (Jean-Charles-Bonenfant Pavilion, Library, 2nd floor, room 2440).
- To pick up your ID card:
 - The card will be virtual
 - Once the photo has been approved (a few days), you will be able to access it via monPortail and present it on an electronic device.

Laissez-passer universitaire (LPU) (Public transit pass)



- The LPU is your public transit card, giving you unlimited access to buses in Quebec City and Lévis, as well as to the ferry between the two cities.
- Mandatory and automatically billed to all **full-time students** (12 credits) enrolled in a **regular program**.
- Cost: \$153.56 per session
- Valid from September 1 to April 30
- Summer session: use the LPU to purchase a reducedrate pass.
- Exchange students can apply using the attestation received by e-mail.

How to get LPU?

Regular study program

- On monPortail:
 - Following approval of your photo for the ULaval ID card, go to the Services section of monPortail and follow the steps.
- To pick up the LPU: by mail 7-10 business days.
- To find out the consequences of a change to part-time study on the LPU, consult the dedicated page on the ULaval Website.

How to get LPU?

Exchange program

- Optional
- You will automatically receive an e-mail from the Registrar's Office confirming your registration.
- To obtain your LPU, present yourself with the attestation at the following location:
 - o RTC Service Centre: 820 avenue Ernest-Gagnon, Quebec City.
 - \$153.56 fees are due on site.





Your studies

Semester

- o 15 weeks
- 3 sessions per year: fall, winter and summer

Full-time studies

- Minimum 12-credit enrolment for fall and winter sessions
- 2nd research cycle and 3rd cycle: check with your academic advisor that your research credits give you full-time status.

Credit

- A 3-credit course = 3 hours of face-to-face or distance learning classes and 6 hours of personal work per week
- 12 credits = 36 hours of work per week (1st cycle)

Course outline

- o Objectives, evaluation methods, materials to be purchased, etc.
- Detailed explanations during the first class





Your studies

- Fast-paced session from the first week of class
- No retake exams
- Autonomy in learning
- Be proactive!
- Contact with teaching staff



Pedagogical material

- Purchase of books and lecture notes at the <u>Librairie</u> <u>Coop Zone</u>
- New or used equipment, and book resale on <u>LEXYA</u>
- Student Facebook page (used books)

Plagiarism and intellectual property

Intellectual integrity is a fundamental value at Université Laval.

- Plagiarism can have serious consequences for your academic career (including exclusion from a program).
- Various training courses are available on <u>MonPortail</u> and the <u>Université Laval library Website</u> to avoid plagiarism.
- ➤ The BVE also offers you <u>a presentation</u> on this subject.

Cumulative average

The grade point average is calculated on a total of 4.33, which is equivalent to A+. To avoid exclusion from the program, you must maintain an average over 12 credits (one session) of more than:

- 1st cycle: 2.0/4.33 (C)
- 2nd cycle: 2.67/4.33 (B-)
- 3rd cycle: based on doctoral exam

* Please note: your program may have higher or more diversified pass requirements. These can be found on MonPortail, or in your progress report. Your academic advisor can also provide you with further information.

Important dates

Course selection modification

- End of course modification period: January 21
- Withdrawal with refund: January 27 11.59 pm*
- Withdrawal without refund: March 24 11:59 pm*

*Please note: When you withdraw from a course, whether with or without a refund, and your total number of credits falls below 12 for the semester, you lose full-time student status. This can have a number of consequences, including the loss of your right to work and your eligibility for certain scholarships.

Language requirements

- French language requirement: Certain requirements may apply if French is not your mother tongue or if you have studied in another language.
- English language requirement: Some programs require a certain level of English.

We recommend that you take <u>an English or French language test</u> at the Language School **at the start of your studies** to avoid certain possible consequences:

- Delayed graduation
- Consequences on the possible renewal of your legal status in Canada

Contact your academic advisor or consult your <u>progress report</u> to verify the language requirements of your program of study!

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT STATUS AND THE RIGHT TO WORK

International student status

Under Quebec and Canadian law, certain conditions must be met:

- You must make your studies your principal activity and make reasonable progress in a timely manner. Throughout your studies, you must be enrolled full-time (minimum 12 credits) in all mandatory sessions of your program of study. Validate your fulltime enrolment status with your academic advisor.
- Have health and hospitalization insurance for yourself and accompanying family members at all times.
- Respect the terms of the right to work.

International student status

- Always have valid immigration documents: If your studies continue beyond the expiry date of your legal documents, or if you change your course of study, you must <u>renew</u> <u>your documents</u> 3 to 6 months before they expire.
- As soon as you obtain a new CAQ or study permit, send it to the Registrar's Office.
- You should make **scanned or photocopied copies of your legal documents** and keep them in a safe place. Do not carry the originals around with you.
- Inform Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada of any change of educational institution.

Right to work

- Upon arrival, the right to work begins on the first day of the session
- Make sure your study permit indicates that you are authorized to work in Canada.
- If you meet all the conditions, you can work on campus. You can also work up to 24 hours a week off-campus, with no time limit on school vacations.
- If you withdraw from a course during the semester and are no longer a full-time student (less than 12 credits), you must stop working immediately.



Please note:

To carry out one or more internships as part of your program of study at Université Laval, you must be in possession of <u>an internship-coop work permit</u>. The permit is free of charge.

HEALTH AND HOSPITALIZATION INSURANCE


Desjardins Insurance

- Mandatory and automatic membership. Some exemptions possible (e.g. RAMQ).
- Coverage effective upon arrival, no earlier than **December 15**.
- **Billing:** Automatic with registration.
- Price: \$1068 for the year / \$356 per session.
- **Membership card**: Contract and certificate number sent by e-mail by the registrar's office.

Desjardins Insurance

Membership or payment card: must be <u>downloaded</u> with the information provided by the Registrar's Office.

Régie de l'assurance maladie du Québec (RAMQ)

For citizens of countries that have signed a **reciprocal agreement** with Quebec:

- ➤ Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Greece, Luxembourg, Norway, Portugal, Romania, Serbia and Sweden.
- Please refer to the <u>Steps to take</u> on the Registrar's Office Immigration Website and follow the steps.
- Do NOT go to the RAMQ offices, registration is done <u>online</u>.
- Send proof of eligibility to the Registrar's Office **by e-mail** at <u>assurances@reg.ulaval.ca</u>

Complementary insurance: Alliance pour la santé étudiante au Québec (ASÉQ)

- Complementary insurance offered by your student associations:
 - o CADEUL: 1st cycle students
 - AELIES: 2nd and 3rd cycle students
- Health and dental insurance available
- Please note that these insurances are relevant but not mandatory. Withdrawal possible between January 15 and February 15.

Social insurance number (SIN)

• A <u>Social Insurance Number (SIN)</u> obtained from Service Canada is required to **work**.

*Please note: Your SIN is confidential!

- You can apply for your SIN online. The process is easy, free and fast.
- You can also apply for your SIN by making an appointment to attend the SIN Clinic offered on campus during the back-to-school period (upcoming dates to come).
